Code of Conduct

Parent participation is the touchstone of our Home & School Association (“HSA”) and an integral part of the total school program. Your willingness to volunteer is appreciated by students, staff and the community.

As an HSA Member, the core ingredients of character should be displayed when interacting with faculty and students. HSA Members are expected to comply with the following:

- HSA Members shall treat others with dignity and respect. The behavior of members is a reflection on the HSA and our Brookdale Community.
- HSA Members shall not take advantage of their relationship with staff or students for personal advantage.
- HSA Members are to be fair and shall not show preferential treatment in their volunteer roles.
- While on school premises, HSA Members shall not consume any substances that may result in impairment of their full faculties. Further, HSA Members shall not attend any HSA-sponsored function while in an impaired state.
- HSA Members shall not, in the performance of their duties, by words or conduct, demonstrate prejudice or bias based on race, sex, religion, age, disability, national origin, or sexual orientation, and shall not allow members of their committees or those under their supervision to do so.
- Monthly meetings are held to review and approve minutes, review the financials, hear from our faculty and principal, address old and new business and hear updates regarding various HSA programs and initiatives. This is not the place to discuss grievances. Attendees will be asked to address such issues privately with the applicable chairperson and the HSA Executive Board, and the meeting will continue as per the agenda.

We require that all attendees at HSA meetings and events are respectful, patient, kind and tolerant of one another. Volunteering is a privilege, not a right. Failure to comply is grounds for an HSA Executive Board review for further action.
